Testing Sites

Monterey County has two no-cost community testing sites in Salinas and Greenfield.

Great Plates Delivered



The County is partnering with local restaurants and food providers for Great Plates Delivered.

This program will provide home delivery of up to three meals a day, seven days a week, for adults 65 and older and adults 60-64 who are at high-risk from COVID-19. Seniors may call 2-1-1 for application/screening.
