It is another beautiful sunny day in Del Rey Oaks! Here are a few updates for you from the City. City Council will consider submitting a letter to the State supporting Monterey County's request to further open businesses in the near future. Please join your Council Tuesday evening at 6:00pm as they consider this important issue. We will be joined by County Administrative Officer Charles McKee to address questions. The attached County newsletter provides some good information on the subject. If the Board of Supervisors approves it at their meeting Tuesday, and the State grants the request, it could mean that Tarp's and other restaurants in Del Rey Oaks could be allowed to open for dining as long as social distancing and other safety protocols are observed.

The COVID testing center at Monterey Peninsula College has proven so popular that they have run short of testing supplies. Watch the County website for updates on this location. The County still has capacity for those wishing to be tested at the Salinas and Greenfield locations. The Salinas testing location is moving to the Ag Commissioners Offices at 1424 Abbott Street. Parks are open to enjoy getting some fresh air. Plan before you go for a hike, run, walk, or ride by having a mask and keeping a safe distance from others.

Council will meet Tuesday night to consider some very important matters, many involving the sunset of FORA on June 30. Please join us by zoom link posted in the kiosks and on the City website. They will consider an agreement with Marina Coast Water District for provision of water service to the City's Fort Ord properties after FORA closes. Council will also consider an agreement to transfer the South Boundary Road Project from FORA to the City including \$8.8 million to complete the project. They will consider an agreement with FORA to receive approximately \$750,000 to be used to pay for environmental studies related to development and other habitat management purposes. The Council will consider extending the urgency ordinance protecting residential and commercial tenants from eviction. The Council will receive updates on two litigation matters in closed session. The City continues to defend itself against these frivolous lawsuits from LandWatch of Monterey County and a Mr Robert.

Thank you to our City Council and Planning Commission for their leadership by example. Thanks to all of you from your City Staff for your continued grace under pressure.

Finally, as we deal with the challenges of the pandemic and the passions of strongly held views on important policy issues, it is fitting that we take a moment this Memorial Day weekend to remember those who paid with their lives to preserve our vibrant democracy. May our actions be worthy of their sacrifice.
