A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR EDELEN



I want to thank all of our citizens for the overwhelming support of the 1 cent sales tax add-on during last November's election.

The tax measure passed with an 85.68% approval rate. This is the highest approval rate of any tax measure in any municipality or county in California on record!! I believe your support of this measure reflects your collective pride in our city, your positive vision for our future and your trust in your City Council to be judicious and wise in investing the additional funds generated by this tax. Our city has struggled financially for years; but, we have now turned the corner.

We are now in the final stages of severing all ties to the former development firm of our Fort Ord property. Federal Development LLC has not honored its contractual agreement with us and we are almost at the end of the legal process of releasing this firm and bringing in a new developer. During the new developer selection process, we will ask for citizen input as to what type of development you'd like to see on our Fort Ord property. We envision a low density, revenue producing development so that we can maintain a lot of the natural environment there and also bring in additional revenues to modernize our infrastructure and substantially improve the quality of life in our city. The revenues generated will help us to upgrade our park; underground the power lines; and add sidewalks, street lamps, etc. Of course, these projects, and others will take time; but, we'll soon have the financial assets to move in this direction.

We are also in negotiations to sell/ lease the 17 acre site across from the Moose Lodge. Our goal is to substantially improve access to this location so that all of our citizens can enjoy the natural surroundings. We are not looking to commercially develop this site.

Finally, talks are also underway to put the old Golf Driving Range to better use and also provide additional revenues. Currently, three possible activities are being considered. As negotiations solidify, project status reports will be made during City Council meetings and will be posted in the city kiosks.

Before any agreements are finalized, they will be brought before the City Council for both citizen and council review, and approval.

Again, thank you for your support. I am honored to serve as your Mayor.

Time sure flies, doesn't it? It has already been 3 years that I have been your City Manager and I still learn something new almost every day!

The challenges faced by Cities and the State, in the toughest economic times since the great depression, have continued but we are

Sales tax revenue is up and we are fortunate that when Clementine's Kitchen went out of business, they were replaced by Stone Creek Kitchen a wonderful new store that includes cooking classes, something I sorely need! As we approach resolution of these issues in the near future, you will all be encouraged to help select the very best project mix on the property to provide the greatest long term benefits for your City.

Your City Council and Planning Commission are among the most dedicated and caring group of public servants that I have ever had the pleasure of working with! We are well positioned to lead the City toward growth and prosperity that will keep this a small City while also ensuring economic vitality into the future.

I am delighted with the solid group of dedicated law-enforcement professionals that we have now assembled to provide excellent service and protection to our residents! Old Town Hall is located at the entrance to our beautiful Del Rey Oaks Park and is available to rent. Please call 394-8511 to ask about available dates.




2012 Clean-Up Days are Del Rey Oaks May 7 and October 1


On your regular pick-up days of Monday, May 7th and October 1st you may leave up to <u>seven additional bags</u> or <u>seven 32-gallon garbage cans</u> in addition to your regular garbage. Make sure bags and cans are secured and at the curb with your regular garbage by 6:00 a.m. Please **NO** bulky items

(such as furniture, water heaters or refrigerators) unless you have pre-arranged a pick up for a large item with Waste Management at (831) 384-5000 and <u>NO</u> Hazardous waste!

If the items you're throwing away are reusable, consider donating them to local charities, or holding a yard sale with your neighbors for extra cash. Also, check if any of the items are approved to be set out with your recyclables. Remember, reusing is another way of recycling.

Waste Management now offers <u>smaller trash cans</u> for easier handling. Call 384-5000 for information.

Residents Complaints and Concerns

There is an RV parked on the street and it never moves!



The Del Rey Oaks Municipal Code states in part: No person who owns or has possession, custody or control of any vehicle shall park such vehicle upon any street or alley for more than a consecutive period of seventy-two (72) hours and RV's may only park on improved driveways.

Why are my neighbor's garbage cans out for a week?

The Del Rey Oaks Municipal Code states in



part: It is unlawful for any persons to allow garbage or refuse container(s) to remain at the curb for a longer period of time than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the date of collection, or for a longer period of time than twenty-four (24) hours after collection.

My neighbor's dog never stops barking! It's waking me up and I have to work in the morning!



The Del Rey Oaks Municipal Code states in part: It is unlawful to keep any dog which by reason of its barking, howling, yelping or other noise habitually disturbs the peace any person.

There is construction going on down the block, did they get a



permit? Call City Hall

(394-8511) to find out if you need a permit <u>before</u> you begin any construction or repairs! These permits are issued for your protection. A permit will require that our building inspector checks construction to make sure that it conforms to the Uniform Building Code and that the Contractor has a business license and roper insurance.

Did my neighbor get permission to cut down/trim that

Oaks Municipal Code states in part: Any person desiring to remove, cut down, destroy, alter, relocate, prune and/or trim, or otherwise undertake activities which could inflict damage to an oak or other significant tree, shall first obtain a tree permit from the City.

Can I put concrete or one of those metal grates or on my driveway approach? My car bottoms

Municipal Code states in part: All driveway approaches shall not obstruct or endanger the normal and customary pedestrian and vehicular traffic and the normal flow of water. They are <u>very</u> dangerous for kids on bicycles. Call City Hall for plans.





The City of Del Rey Oaks is a permitted member of the Monterey Regional Storm Water Management Program (MRSWMP).

One of the regional storm water permit program responsibilities is to properly manage urban runoff and storm water that drains into the Monterey Bay via the storm drain system , and to prevent pollutants entering the storm drain system (oil, carpet cleaning wastewater, auto detailing soaps and rinse water, restaurant mat and trash area wash down, pesticides/fertilizers from landscapes, etc).

ALL storm drains flow <u>directly</u> to either the Monterey Bay or other water bodies throughout the area; they do not go through a treatment process prior to draining to the sea water bodies. <u>Only rain should go into storm drains</u>.

Del Rey Oaks is also responsible for implementation of the City's annual storm water program, with assistance from our regional program manager, and compliance with the State's storm water regulations utilizing best management practices (BMPs) to meet measureable goals outlined in our adopted storm water plan.

You as our residents have a crucial role in our Storm Water Program. These include:

- Report any foreign liquids or solids you see in the City gutters or streets, or entering the storm drain system to the Police Department at 831-375-8525. Some examples would be paint, fuel, concrete wash off, sewage & debris, including litter, etc. Also report anyone you see dumping fluids or sweeping lawn debris/leaves into storm drains.
- If you see any liquid coming out of a manhole, report it immediately to the Police Department.
- Please keep the gutter in front of your home free of leaves, pine needles and other
 - debris , minimize the usage of pesticides or fertilizers, and minimize lawn irrigation to prevent runoff and water waste .
- Do not change the oil or other fluids of your vehicle in the street and ensure your car does not leak oil onto the street (if parked on the street)
 - Move your vehicle out of the street on street sweeping days (Usually the first Wednesday of each Month).
