

New Chief of Police, a Promotion and a new Reserve Officer

Interim Chief of Police Steve Belcher has left the City in good hands after aiding the department in the transition from old school to the advanced standards required in all police departments today. No small undertaking! He has implemented new protocols, additional training and standard practices that have been previously overlooked. As Interim Chief of Police he was tasked with bringing on a new Chief. Chief Jeff Hoyne joined the City on October 2, 2017. He has been the Chief of Police for the Monterey Peninsula Airport District and is now splitting his time between the two agencies under a mutual agreement between the City Council and the Airport District Board.

Sergeant Bourquin has been promoted to Commander and is running the day to day operations of the department. He has earned those stripes after 22 years with Del Rey Oaks Police Department and has proven that he is more than ready for the additional responsibility.

A new addition to our Police Department is Reserve Office Kyle Baum. He is currently working with his Field Training Officer, Corporal Nguyen and learning about the city, residents and neighborhoods. If you see him out and about please welcome him to Del Rey Oaks.

A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR EDELEN



We are currently experiencing one of the most important transitional periods in our city's history.

Gone are the days when some city employees forgot that their primary duty was to serve our residents, sought to ignore residents' requests, and sought to undermine the City Council's attempt to address those requests.

Our new City Manager, Dino Pick, has assembled his new Management Team and has made incredible progress towards refocusing his team on responding to our residents' needs.

Our Interim Chief of Police Steve Belcher has a California state-wide reputation for joining police departments with "issues" and resolving these issues. His tenure with our city has been no different. He has made many major improvements and our police department is now in compliance with California State Law Enforcement Standards. He is currently transitioning in our new Chief of Police Jeff Hoyne.

On September 29th, Chief Hoyne was sworn in as Chief of Police for BOTH Del Rey Oaks and the Monterey Peninsula Airport District- a huge advantage to both our city and the district. Both our organizations will experience cost savings and we will have greater flexibility in assigning personnel and we will have access to greater resources in serving our resident's needs.

Last month, Sergeant Bourquin earned a well-deserved promotion to Police Commander. His professionalism and dedicated service to our residents is universally acknowledged and much appreciated.

We have totally eliminated the unresponsive tone of the past at City Hall. Going forward residents will be encouraged to engage City Hall, "Adopt a Traffic Island", beautify their common areas, submit ideas to improve the quality of life in our city, and express their ideas freely and without fear of retribution at City Council meetings.

Dino Pick will elaborate later in this issue of the Acorn on the major revenue increases we are beginning to receive. Suffice it to say, at the end of this fiscal year, we will have built the first budget reserve in our City's history! And, we will have sufficient funds to begin slurry sealing our streets this Spring. This is just the beginning.

Our city's future has never been so bright!

A Message from City Manager Dino Pick

It has been a busy and productive first six months serving our community. Interim Police Chief Steve Belcher spent four months making important changes in our Police Department including finding a new home for the Mine Resistant Armored Personnel (MRAP) Vehicle with another agency. We are fortunate to have Chief Jeff Hoyne assume duties as Chief of Police of Del Rey Oaks. He also serves as Chief of the Airport Police. This collaboration has already provided us with more depth in our police depart-

ment as we serve our City. I expect this collaboration to grow and offer us increased capabilities and efficiencies as we look at combining departments then providing contract police services to the Airport. Sergeant Chris Bourquin was promoted to Police Commander acknowledging the incredible contribution he makes to our department and City. Finally, we have a new Officer in our ranks with the recent swearing in of Officer Kyle Baum. He looks young, but is highly capable, extremely motivated and brings a very positive fresh perspective to our Department as we serve the Community.

Our Public Works staff have been working diligently to keep our park, trails, and stairway easements clear and looking good for the enjoyment of our residents and visitors. This includes beautifying our entry way signs with flowers donated by Del Rey Oaks Garden Center. We do not have the resources to do all we would like to beautify the City so I am pleased to report an exciting partnership with the Del Rey Oaks Citizen's Action Group (CAG) and various volunteer groups. This Adopt-an-Island program has resulted in the adoption and beautification of public spaces such as our traffic islands and the results are fantastic. Take a look at the island at Portola/Quendale or at the end of Los Encinos. The pride shows. Some of the volunteers are from our new partner unit from the Defense Language Institute, so I'd like to thank the young airmen of the 314th Training Squadron for their help. If you are interested in adopting an island please contact City Hall or the Citizen's Action Group for more information. Finally, an aspiring Eagle Scout has been working to replace damaged timbers on the tables in our park, clear trails, and install owl boxes in the woods surrounding the park. He will be back to paint the tables once the wood cures.

Your City staff continue to reach out in various ways to share information and listen to residents. The City held an Open House in Old Town Hall, continues to post notices of events or public service notices online, and we have started a monthly coffee with the City Manager that we will move from business to business and vary times to allow residents with various schedules to attend if they choose.

We held a productive public workshop with a highly qualified traffic calming engineer concerning traffic calming on Portola/Quendale and Carlton. The next workshop is scheduled for November 2, from 5-7 pm to refine concepts before presenting an option to Council for approval. We are aiming for construction of whatever is decided in the Spring.

Your City staff is heavily engaged with the Fort Ord Reuse Authority to install the public infrastructure on our Fort Ord parcel to allow for future development. These infrastructure projects include the reconstruction of South Boundary Road, and the extension of power, sewer, and water utilities down South Boundary. We will keep the public informed of progress.

The City's revenue outlook has never been better. We recently received our first tranche of Measure X revenue, and will begin receiving new State transportation funds through Senate Bill 1 to help with road maintenance. Our Cannabis tax is providing revenue that will allow roadwork, debt service and allow us to form the first reserve in the City's history. The City received a \$146,000 FORA grant to cover costs associated with caring for the Fort Ord parcel. As a result of this revenue outlook, you will see road slurry work in the Spring and traffic calming work on Portola/Quendale and Carlton.

Thanks to all of you who are volunteering your time to serve, whether on Council, Planning Commission, the CAG or in various ways helping beautify our City and put on wonderful events. It is a pleasure to serve our community and I appreciate the interactions I've had with each of you!

Adopt-an-Island A Great Success Story

Del Rey Oaks started an Adopt-an-Island program many years ago, but until just recently it didn't seem like the idea was going to go anywhere. That's changed! We now have several islands that have been adopted and are starting to really look beautiful. In our last Acorn we featured the island located at the end of Los Encinos. Since then there has been a transformation of the island at the intersection of Portola and Quendale as well. Everyone that has volunteered has done an amazing job and we couldn't be more thankful! Open House

The City held an open house on August 11th for anyone interested in talking to city officials and staff about anything they like. Mayor Edelen and City Manager Dino Pick gave a short presentations on topics such as future developments planned by the Transportation Administration of Monterey County (TAMC) that will effect the City regarding traffic on Hwy 68 and Canyon Del Rey as well as general happenings at City Hall and throughout the city in general. We invited the public to have an open dialog about concerns, ideas, suggestions and to give everyone a chance to have a face to face conversation with City Officials and staff. It was a great event and lots of good information was exchanged. As well as residents, city officials and staff it was also attended by the Seaside Fire Department, the City Building Inspector Joe Headley, the City Attorney Alex Lorca and representatives from the Del Rey Oaks Citizen's Action Group (DROCAG). This has become a regular event so if you are interested in attending the next one, just look for the flyer that will be hand-delivered to your residence giving the date and time of the next open house. 



Traffic Calming Workshop

The City held a traffic calming workshop in September to receive input from residents on their concerns and ideas about calming traffic specifically on Portola Drive, Quendale Avenue and Carlton Drive. We reported on the measures taken on Carlton in the last Acorn. We reported on the traffic calming measures taken on Carlton in the last Acorn. These changes were met with some acceptance and some discontent. That's why we are taking a different approach. The City held a traffic calming workshop in September to receive input from residents on their concerns and ideas about calming traffic specifically on Portola Drive, Quendale Avenue and Carlton The traffic engineer discussed various means of calming traffic. The public had an open forum to speak directly to the engineer about their concerns and then received excellent feedback from the engineer on what can and cannot be done. It was a valuable exchange of information and everyone walked away feeling like they'd accomplished something.

We have now hired the engineering firm of Kimley-Horn to develop and present two options for each street at the next workshop based on public input from the first workshop. Kimley-Horn engineer Frederik Ventor will then refine the plan to a recommended option for each street for City Council approval.

The next Traffic Calming Workshop is scheduled for November 2nd from 5-7 pm at City Hall. This is a good step in the right direction and the process if working. Please join us.
